## Progress – Key Stage 1 – Key Stage 2

Progress scores compare pupils KS2 results to those of pupils nationally who achieved a similar end of KS1 results. This is achieved by calculating a pupils average score from when they were assessed at the end of Year 2 across reading, writing and maths.

Children are then put into bands and their KS2 scores are compared with other children within the same band.

- A score of “0” means that pupils in school do “about as well at KS2 as those with similar prior attainment national”.
- A positive score (greater than 0) means that pupils in school “do better at KS2 than those with similar prior attainment nationally.”
- A negative score (significantly less than 0) means that pupils in school do “not do as well at KS2 than those with similar prior attainment nationally”.
