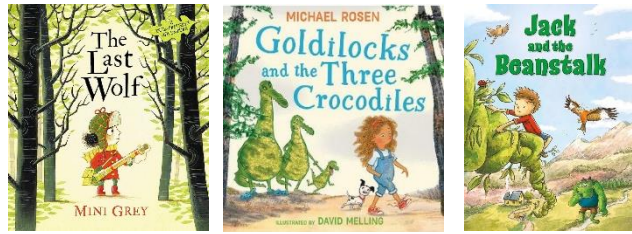

Traditional Tales

Can you tell me a story?



Vocabulary:

- Traditional tale – A story that has been retold for many years. Sometimes called a fairy tale.
- Adventure- An exciting journey the character go on.
- Setting – Where a story takes place, such as a forest.
- Plot- It describes the events that make up a story.
- Character- A person or animal in the story.
- Fable- A short story that has a moral.
- Hero- An important character in a story. A hero is usually a character who is good and helps people.
- Villain- A character who is the opposite of the hero. The villain might be mean and unkind.
- Stranger- Someone who a character doesn't know.
- Imagination – The ability to think of new ideas, image or stories in their mind.
