

Vocabulary:

Police man/woman: someone whose job it is to help keep people safe and make sure they follow the rules

Fire man/woman: someone who puts out fire and helps people and animals in emergencies

Fire engine: The large red vehicle which firefighters use to get to fire which has special tools and equipment in.

Paramedic: A person who helps people who are sick or hurt especially in emergencies.

Ambulance: The big yellow vehicle that paramedics drive, it helps get sick or injured to hospital safely.

Doctor: Someone who helps people get better, they are normally in a hospital.

Nurse: A person who helps sick or injured people to get better, the nurse often works with a doctor.

Hospital: A place where sick or injured people go to get help and treatment

Vet: A person who helps sick or injured animals.

Emergency: A situation where there is a dangerous risk to person, animal or things.

Dentist: A doctor who takes care of your teeth and mouth.

Postal worker: A person who delivers mail to homes.

Uniform: A special set of clothes that people in an organisation wear who people know who they are.

999: The phone number to call when someone needs immediate help.

Emergency services: A group of people who help when someone serious or dangerous happens.
