What a wonderful week we've had in school for British Science week. We started off with a bang on Monday morning with a whole school assembly led and organised by Miss Taplin where the theme was "Curiosity". The children were on the edge of their seats with all the brilliant science experiments and explanations as to how they worked! It really was interactive, involved lots of bangs from balloons and made science fun.

Thankyou to Miss Taplin for spending the time to plan and deliver this for everyone.

Following this, classes have had some live lessons and then on Tuesday we had our whole school science workshops. The children were split into 4 mixed age groups and each group went around 4 different science investigations in each classroom planned by the staff. There were paper aeroplane and helicopter investigations, chromatography experiments with trolls, making nests only using "beaks" and making boats in teams with limited equipment to see which would hold the most marbles.

Wow!!! Today we have seen so many amazing marble runs brought in to school for our "Marble run challenge!" All the staff have been so impressed with the time and effort that has gone in to creating these. They really were fabulous. In order to ensure a fair test, Miss Taplin and Cat Hind have overseen the testing of them this morning and the winning marble runs were given special prizes in STAR assembly today.

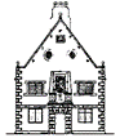

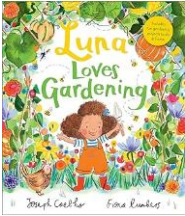

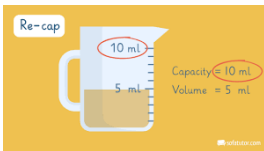


Willow Class



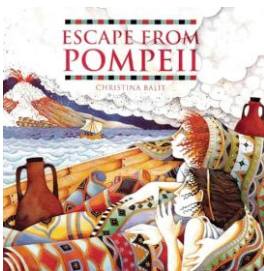
This week in Willow we have learning all about plants and what they need to change from a seed to a plant or flower. We have finished our work around the text Luna Loves Gardening by writing a set of instructions on how to plant a seed. In maths nursery have been exploring position and reception have been looking at the number 10. In outdoor learning we planted lots of seeds for the allotment. In Computing we went of a photo walk practicing our photography skills.

Chestnut Class



Chestnut Class have had another productive week. Thank you to Miss Taplin for leading our wonderful Science Week. We have been busy with a fantastic workshop day, live lessons about animals and of course the Marble Run competition. In English, the children worked hard to write, edit and present their own chapter stories, using different sentence forms, expanded noun phrases and imaginative similes. In maths, Year 2 got messy while learning about millilitres and investigating the difference between volume and capacity, while Year 1 explored mass using a range of informal units. Our geography work took us further on our journey to St Lucia. Everyone researched new facts about the island before we headed out onto the village green to compare its physical and human features with those of our own local area. To round off the week, the children created beautiful abstract artworks inspired by photographs of St Lucia, drawing on the colours, shapes and textures they observed.

Oak Class



Oak class were thoroughly excited about our Science-themed morning on Tuesday and showed great curiosity across all four investigations. The children asked thoughtful questions and eagerly tested their ideas to find answers, e.g. experimenting with adding extra paperclips to their paper helicopters to see if they would spin and fly faster. In RE, we continued exploring the journey of life and discussed how and why people mark important milestones. In English, we started to read our new text 'Escape from Pompeii' and we have been exploring expanded noun phrases to help give a detailed picture in the mind of the reader. In maths, we have continued to learn about fractions, looking at equivalent fraction families, mixed fractions and improper fraction families in particular. In Spanish we have learnt the names of 5 more vegetables and looked at the spellings of these. In DT we have begun to use papier mache to create our volcanoes.

Hawthorn Class

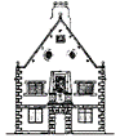
What a fantastic week we've had in Hawthorn class. We enjoyed the science workshops on Tuesday and had so much fun. In maths they developed their understanding of angles. They learned how to use a protractor accurately to measure different angles and practised identifying and measuring a variety of angle sizes. Inspired by video footage from Shackleton's expedition, the children wrote their own poems about the ship's journey. They used powerful vocabulary and descriptive language to bring the harsh Antarctic environment to life in their writing. The class enjoyed swimming where they had lots of fun in the water while continuing to develop their confidence and technique. It was wonderful to see their enthusiasm and determination during the lesson.
