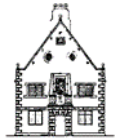

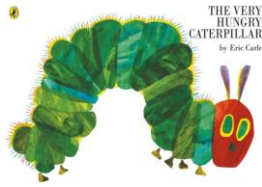

Willow Class



This week in Willow we had fun celebrating St Patrick's day by decorating shamrocks and learning about who St Patrick is. We learnt about different animal lifecycles and got to meet some very cute chicks. We have started a new text of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. In maths nursery have been exploring collection of big and small items as well as collection with the same number of items. Reception have been exploring odd and even numbers to 10, and doubling to ten. In SCARF, nursery discussed the topic of boys, girl and families. Reception discussed getting bigger and changes over time.

Chestnut Class



On Monday, Chestnut Class enjoyed a wonderful imaginary trip to St Lucia. After organising their passports and tickets, the children boarded their flight and set off on their exciting adventure. Their first activity was work experience at the Tourist Information Office, where everyone created their own visitor information leaflets showing off all their knowledge about the island. A break followed with a delicious snack of Windward Island bananas, before the children took part in a colourful craft session inspired by tropical fish. In the afternoon, they learned how chocolate is made and then enthusiastically joined a chocolate-tasting session. To finish the day, the class enjoyed a lively beach disco and wrote postcards home. All too soon it was time to catch their flight back—returning just in time for the end of the school day.

Oak Class



This week in Oak class we've been so impressed with the children's resilience during some assessments that we've been doing. They've worked so hard to show their understanding and deserve a big well done! To celebrate we've enjoyed a little bit of extra time in the sunshine! In RE this week, we've been learning about how the Sacred Thread Ceremony is celebrated in some Hindu communities and how it is recognised. In DT we've been putting the final touches on our volcanoes, making them look as realistic as possible ready for their eruptions next week! In Spanish we've continued to learn about vegetables and how to order them in a market. We've also continued to explore different ways to help us feel regulated, calm, and ready to learn.

Hawthorn Class



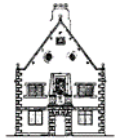
This week, the children have engaged enthusiastically across the curriculum. In Geography, they explored the key differences between human and physical features. They developed their ability to classify and describe these features, applying their knowledge to the diverse landscape of Brazil. The children showed great interest in identifying examples such as rivers, mountains, and rainforests alongside cities and landmarks, and were able to discuss how both types of features shape the environment and the way people live. In English, the class immersed themselves in their class text, writing thoughtful and imaginative diary entries from the perspective of the dogs aboard *The Endurance*. In Maths, the focus has been on 3D shapes. The children have been identifying and describing their properties, including faces, edges, and vertices. They also explored nets of 3D shapes.
