Headteacher update

SCREENWISE update

I have had a big thankyou from Arwen and Emily at Screenwise to all the parents who came to the parent workshop last week. They will be sending me a youtube link to watch the recording in case you missed it. Once I have it next week, I'll let you know.

As requested, I have also contacted the safeguarding lead at South Wolds Academy to find out about their mobile phone policy. The important parts to note are:

Mobile phones, smart watches and other electronic music or games devices should not be used on school premises by students at any time. Students who choose to bring devices to school should keep them switched off and out of sight. Students know that mobile phones, smart watches (and other electronic music or games devices) are not to be used whilst at school and that they will be confiscated if seen, used or heard.

Students who ignore this policy and use a mobile or other unauthorised device on school premises will be required to give their phone/device to a member of staff immediately. Students will be asked to collect it from main reception at the end of the day. If the phone (or other electronic music or games device) is confiscated on a second occasion a parent or carer will be expected to collect it personally from school.

Failure to hand the phone/device over to a member of staff when requested, will be seen as refusing staff instructions and will therefore lead to serious sanctions such as a period of time in the Restoration Room -or even exclusion. We ask that parents/carers support us in this policy so that students are aware that this is a shared responsibility.

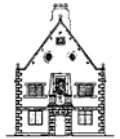


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Bunny Bash- Friday 3rd July 5-8pm

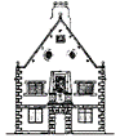

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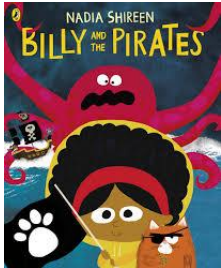
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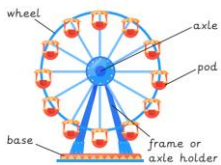


Willow Class



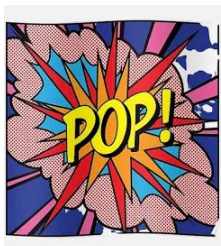
This week in Willow we have started a new literacy text, Billy and the Pirates. We have done some writing predicting what we think Billy found in the message in the bottle and thought about what maps are and who uses them. We are practising writing sentences more independently using our phonetical knowledge to help us. In maths, reception have been exploring sharing and doubling numbers. Nursery have continued their learning around subitising. On Friday, the children received a message in a bottle from a pirate who has lost their buried , so the children used the map to help the pirate find their treasure. In scarf, reception have been thinking about what is safe to go into their body and nursery have been thinking about which people can keep them safe.

Chestnut Class



This week in Chestnut Class, the children have been working hard to develop their speaking and listening skills in preparation for our performance next week, showing growing confidence and expression. In English, we have also been learning how to add the suffix -er to change word classes, alongside continuing to take pride in our handwriting progress. In maths, both year groups have now successfully completed their topics, with Year 1 finishing place value to 100 and Year 2 completing their work on statistics. Year 2 have enjoyed asking for everyone's favourite things so that they can make tallies, block graphs and pictograms. We have also begun an exciting new DT project, where the children are designing their very own fairground wheel, using their creativity and problem-solving skills. Despite the wet weather, the children have enjoyed a busy week in PE, taking part in games and developing their skills in cricket.

Oak Class



This week in Oak Class, we have been busy with lots of exciting learning across the curriculum. In English, we created our own imaginative Lost Things and designed lost posters and lost tags, using descriptive language to help others identify them. In Maths, our Year 4 pupils completed their Multiplication Tables Check at the beginning of the week and worked incredibly hard. We then continued our learning about shape, exploring angles and different types of polygons. In Spanish, we learnt the names of a variety of pets and practised using our new vocabulary. In Science, we investigated sound, learning about how sounds are made and how they travel to our ears. We finished the week by continuing to learn about Pop Art, looking at the work by Roy Lichtenstein this week and beginning to create our own self-portraits in his iconic comic book style. We're looking forward to showing them when they are finished.

Hawthorn Class



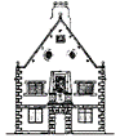
This week, Hawthorn Class began preparations for their exciting summer production of *Peter Pan*. The children have been enthusiastically exploring the story, discussing characters and themes, and starting to learn their roles. In Science, the class investigated whether yeast is a living organism. They combined yeast with warm water and sugar, then carefully observed what happened over time. They noticed that the yeast began to respire, producing carbon dioxide gas as a by-product helping them conclude that it is indeed a living thing. In Mathematics, Year 5 developed their understanding of where negative numbers sit on a number line and practised comparing, ordering and calculating with them. Meanwhile, Year 6 stepped back in time to 1922 and became journalists reporting on one of the most significant archaeological discoveries of the twentieth century. Using their knowledge of the period, they wrote detailed newspaper articles announcing Howard Carter's discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamun.

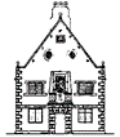
