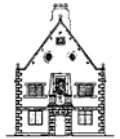

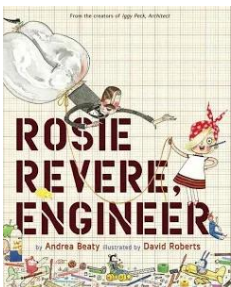


Willow Class

Hawthorn Class



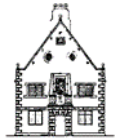
This week, the children have been busy rehearsing and perfecting their dances for the Summer Production. They have shown fantastic enthusiasm, confidence and teamwork as they practised their routines, worked together and supported one another. It has been wonderful to see their excitement grow with each rehearsal, and they are all looking forward to showcasing their hard work on stage! In Science, the children explored the exciting world of forces. They investigated different forces in action, including friction, air resistance and water resistance, and discussed how these forces affect the movement of everyday objects. They also enjoyed using Newton meters to measure the force acting on a variety of objects. Through this practical investigation, they compared the weights of different items and discovered that weight is a force caused by gravity.
