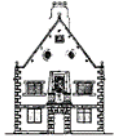

Headteacher update

This will be the last newsletter of this academic year, and what a busy year it's been! From SIAMS inspections, Well Being award accreditation, Gold school games mark, Silver Metal health champions award and sensational SAT's results, we certainly have packed a lot in. We still have 1 week left and as usual, we are not slowing down just yet!

Yesterday, we had the pleasure of watching Peter Pan, our annual production for Oak and Hawthorn classes. I cannot tell you how much work goes in to these productions. Every child has risen to the challenge and learned lines, practiced dances, learned all the songs and all the staff have helped the children bring the play to life and also worked behind the scenes making props and scenery. I was so proud to watch the performances this week and cannot believe just how fantastic everyone was. Huge thankyou to all the parents who have helped out making costumes, scenery and helping make the staging so great. Thankyou to the teachers who have encouraged the children to be the best they can be and HUGE thankyou to Miss Taplin yet again, for bringing her vision to life so beautifully.

Yesterday, our year 6 children received their end of Key Stage 2 SAT's results. Everyone has done so well and I'm delighted to say that 100% of the children who sat the reading test passed. 57% of these got greater depth! We had 93% of the children who sat the SPAG and maths tests who also passed, with 43% again getting greater depth, which is fantastic. Really well done.

Yesterday afternoon, Jack C took part in the grand final of the RMSA STEM flight challenge at Jesse Gray Primary School. Unfortunately Seth was on holiday so couldn't be there. Jack was thrilled to get 3rd place overall and was the winner of the sustainability prize! What a brilliant result! We are so proud of you.

Don't forget that next Tuesday we are heading off to Twycross Zoo on our whole school trip. All children will need a packed lunch, school uniform and hats if it's hot. Children will be carrying their own things during the day so send them with a small backpack they can put their lunches in. If it looks like bad weather, please send a raincoat. The bus will leave promptly at 9am so make sure you arrive a couple of minutes earlier than usual so we can toilet the children before we set off. We should be back at school for approx. 3.30pm.

Next Wednesday, it is the last swimming session for Oak class. As it's water safety, they will need a long sleeved t-shirt and long leggings / long pyjama bottoms to put on over their swimming costumes.

On Wednesday afternoon, the reception children in Willow class will be having their graduation ceremony across at St Marys church. If you have any questions please speak directly to Miss Barrowcliffe.

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Outdoor summer concert/ art gallery – Monday 20th July

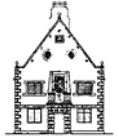
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Willow Class



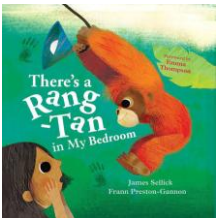

Hawthorn Class



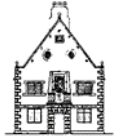
